New study group for Internationally Educated Radiological Technologists

Directions for Internationally Educated Health Professionals (IEHPs) is ready to start a new study group to prepare Internationally Educated Radiological Technologists (also known as X-Ray Technicians) for the Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists (CAMRT) Certification Exam.

To help these professionals prepare for the September 16, 2008 CAMRT Certification Examination, the study group will run for 12 weeks every Thursday, from 9:00 am to 12:30 pm, beginning June 26 and ending on September 11, 2008.

To participate in the CAMRT Study Group, clients are required to register with the Alberta College of Medical Diagnostic and Therapeutic Technologists (ACMDTT) for an assessment before applying for national certification with CAMRT.

The goal of this study group is to help internationally educated radiological technologists be more successful on

the CAMRT exam by providing sample questions, answers and review. This approach will also allow internationally trained professionals to become more comfortable with how to write a multiple choice exam, something many IEHPs may not be accustomed to.

Directions for Internationally Educated Health Professionals will prepare questions based on several textbooks on the CAMRT exam list. Our career coaches will receive support from expert facilitators in the field.

The current success rate of internationally educated Radiological Technologists writing the CAMRT exam is quite low across Canada. The hope is this study group will give our clients a better chance of being successful on the certification exam.
